EXPLAINING THE PROCESS

Every year, Americans for Prosperity-Georgia advocates for and against policies during the session through the use of our Key Vote Alerts and by connecting citizens with their lawmakers on the issues at hand. We monitor how lawmakers vote, and we use our annual scorecard to let folks know how their elected officials voted on some of the most critical issues from each legislative session. This helps to increase government transparency, get citizens engaged in the legislative process, and to inform lawmakers on the issues.



BILL DESCRIPTIONS

HB 51 | EDUCATION; LOCAL BOARDS OF EDUCATION USE VEHICLES OTHER THAN SCHOOL BUSES FOR TRANSPORT OF STUDENTS; AUTHORIZE

Outcome: Signed

AFP's Position: Support

This bill allows local boards of education to use vehicles other than school buses for the transport of all students to and from school and school related activities.

HB 481 | PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS INVESTMENT AUTHORITY LAW; PROVIDE FOR A FIDUCIARY DUTY

Outcome: Passed

AFP's Position: Support

This bill amends the Public Retirement Systems Investment Authority Law so that it sets forth that there is a fiduciary duty to invest retirement assets solely in the financial interest of participants and their beneficiaries.

HB 583 | FOOD, DRUGS, AND COSMETICS; AUTHORIZE PRODUCTION AND SALE OF HOMEMADE FOOD ITEMS WITH CERTAIN EXEMPTIONS

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Support

This bill would allow cottage food producers to sell items to third parties, greatly expanding their sales potential.

HB 909 | GEORGIA BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION; RESTRICTION AND SEAL OF FIRST OFFENDERS ACT

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Support

This bill would require the sealing of First Offender Act court records at the time of sentencing, rather than after sentence completion. This change will ensure that first offenders records are sealed to the public while they are completing their sentence, helping to eliminate barriers to successful reentry.



HB 926 | SECOND CHANCE WORKFORCE ACT; ENACT

Outcome: Passed

AFP's Position: Support

This bill allows individuals who have had their licenses suspended due to failure to appear in court for a uniform traffic citation to have their license reinstated as soon as they schedule a new date to appear before the court. This change makes it easier for individuals to attend their new court appearance, and ensures that their ability to commute to work isn't unnecessarily disrupted.

HB 1015 | INCOME TAX; REDUCE RATE OF TAX

Outcome: Signed

AFP's Position: Support

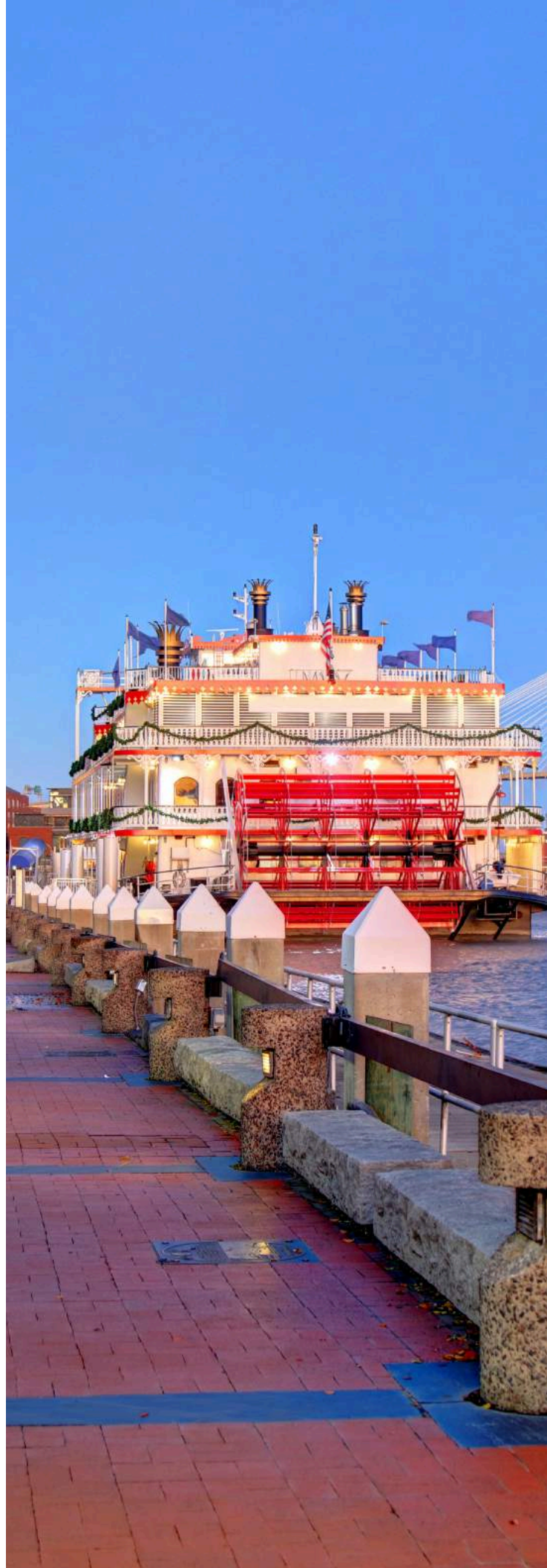
This bill would expedite the reduction in the personal income tax rate.

HB 1339 | HEALTH; CERTIFICATE OF NEED; REVISE

Outcome: Signed

AFP's Position: Support

AFP supports large portions of this bill, including the repeal of CON for new rural hospitals, birthing centers, imaging equipment, and psychiatric and substance abuse facilities.



SB 157 | PROFESSIONS AND BUSINESSES; PRECLEARANCE PROCESS IN THE LICENSING OF INDIVIDUALS WITH CRIMINAL RECORDS WHO MAKE AN APPLICATION TO OR ARE INVESTIGATED BY CERTAIN LICENSING BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Outcome: Crossed Over
AFP's Position: Support

This bill clarifies and removes barriers for people with a past criminal record seeking a state occupational license.

SB 233 | THE GEORGIA PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP ACT'; ESTABLISHMENT OF PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNTS

Outcome: Signed
AFP's Position: Support

This bill establishes Promise Scholarship Accounts, an ESA program that provides students zoned in the bottom 25% of performing schools with \$6,500 to attend the school of their choice.

SB 354 | COSMETOLOGISTS AND BARBERS; PERSONS PERFORMING CERTAIN LIMITED RESPONSIBILITIES; EXEMPT FROM LICENSURE

Outcome: Passed
AFP's Position: Support

This bill allows people to get to work without obtaining a license for certain niche beauty services, like blow dry styling and make up application.

SB 362 | STATE GOVERNMENT; EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATION BY A LABOR ORGANIZATION FOR EMPLOYERS TO RECEIVE CERTAIN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES FROM THE STATE; PROVIDE REQUIREMENTS

Outcome: Signed
AFP's Position: Support

This bill requires that any business receiving state incentives must protect the rights of their workers to have a secret ballot for a unionization vote.

SB 366 | TAX EXPENDITURES TRANSPARENCY ACT OF 2024

Outcome: Signed
AFP's Position: Support

This bill requires more information be provided about the costs of all tax expenditures.



SB 414 | PERSONAL PRIVACY PROTECTION ACT

Outcome: Signed

AFP's Position: Support

This bill ensures no state agency may publicize the private information of supporters of nonprofit organizations.

SB 429 | SMALL BUSINESS PROTECTION ACT OF 2024

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Support

This bill provides guardrails on executive branch regulation, as well as empowering the legislative branch to eliminate outdated or harmful regulations.
